

### Trips & Visits

Trips and visits form an integral part of the degree experience at Plumpton.

We are planning a range of different trips for this new BSc (Hons) Top-up programme. This will include behind-the-scenes visits to some of the UK's top zoological institutions, wildlife organisations and rewilding projects. Local day trips are often run for free, but will generally cost no more than £50 (unless we include an overnight stay).

We are also planning a new study tour to the Cairngorms National Park in Scotland as part of this new Top-up degree, which will include a visit to the Highland Wildlife Park, the Cairngorms Connect Project, RSPB Osprey Centre and dolphin watching with Ecoventures. The approximate cost will be in the region of £400.

Students on this Top-up degree will also have the opportunity to attend our annual international study tour to Mankwe Wildlife Reserve in South Africa. This trip takes place in March and the approximate cost is £1900 (all-inclusive).

These trip costs are indicative and are subject to change. There are bursaries available at Plumpton to support students with the costs of trips and study tours, which are allocated on a needs-assessed basis.

### Research Highlights



Our students have the opportunity to undertake a diverse range of research studies as part of their degree experience, working with the College's own animal collection and a wide range of organisations in the animal industry that we work with. As this is a brand-new Top-up degree, no projects have yet been undertaken, but here are some recent projects undertaken by our other BSc (Hons) final year students, several of which have won awards:

- Investigating captive dalmatian pelican (Pelecanus crispus) behaviour and enclosure use.
- Cultivating conservationists: A case study investigating the value of undergraduate field courses in teaching wildlife conservation.
- The affect of human disturbance and activity on enclosure use and activity of red-necked wallabies (Notamacropus rufogriseus) at Plumpton College.
- The affects of zoo disturbance on social proximity behaviour in captive Arabian rock hyrax (Procavia capensis jayakari).
- A review of current keeper knowledge and care of Viverrids in European collections.

### Equipment List



We require all students to wear appropriate PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) for their own safety and to ensure the welfare of our animals during practical sessions. The two items of compulsory PPE for working at our Animal Management Centre can be purchased online. This year, we have introduced a brand new grey practical uniform for our degree-level learners, but if you are a former student of the College who is progressing, you are welcome to keep and use your old blue uniform. Links to purchase uniforms will be updated soon.

Safety boots can be purchased through alternative retailers (often cheaper) but must have steel toe cap and ankle cover/protection. A range of different sizes are available, so please check this before you place any orders and ensure you keep a receipt for any payments. As for trousers, we advise students to wear black jeans or cargo trousers, which can be purchased from a range of different clothing retailers. Jeans can be any colour but no jeans with holes/rips in them. No leggings or joggers are permitted when working at the Animal Management Centre. You also need to buy some overalls (the colour does not matter) for some of the outdoor practical work you will be undertaking.

Please also note that students are not permitted to wear jewellery during practical sessions when working at the Animal Management Centre, which includes removing any piercings or studs. During your induction, you will be given further information on working practices and requirements for practicals, but please do contact us in advance if you have any queries.
